RECOMMENDATION(S)

Acting as the Board of Directors of the Redevelopment Agency:

1. Approve the Amended Enforceable Obligation Schedule ("Schedule") which outlines the outstanding contracts and obligations of the Redevelopment Agency of the County of San

Bernardino ("Agency").

2. Authorize the County of San Bernardino Redevelopment Agency Executive Officer, Economic Development Agency ("EDA") Administrator, or Redevelopment and Housing Director, upon consultation with County Counsel, to: a) make non-substantial changes in or modifications to the Schedule to comply with ABX1 26; and (b) to execute all necessary documents related to the Schedule and other necessary actions through January 31, 2012 required by the legislation, if necessary.

## BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

### FINANCIAL IMPACT

On June 29, 2011, the Governor signed Assembly Bills X1 26 and X1 27 as part of the State's budget package. These bills eliminated redevelopment agencies (X1 26) and provided a mechanism for an agency to continue operations if it provided funds to the State (X1 27). The League of California Cities and the California Redevelopment Association filed a lawsuit on July 18, 2011 petitioning the California Supreme Court to overturn these bills. On December 29, 2011 the California Supreme Court ruled that Assembly Bill X1 26 (the "Dissolution Act") was constitutional and Assembly Bill X1 27 (the "Alternative Redevelopment Act") was unconstitutional. The Dissolution Act mandates the elimination of every redevelopment agency in California, effective February 1, 2012.

# AMEND THE ENFORCEABLE OBLIGATION SCHEDULE OF THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE COUNTY OF SAN BERNARDINO JANUARY 24, 2012 PAGE 2 OF 2

The amendment of the Enforceable Obligation Schedule ("Schedule") for the period of January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012 will be the last formal action of the Redevelopment Agency of the County of San Bernardino ("Agency"). At a future Board meeting, the County acting as the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the County of San Bernardino ("Successor Agency") will be asked to take various actions relating to the wind-down of the Agency such as considering establishing a new budget, approving semi-annual obligations schedules, and directing staff to transfer all real estate assets if necessary. The full financial impact of the County becoming the Successor Agency will be determined at a later date. This action involves a federal program or the use of federal funds.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Supreme Court decision requires the dissolution of all California redevelopment agencies on February 1, 2012 pursuant to the Dissolution Act. The Dissolution Act provides for the establishment of a Successor Agency and an Oversight Board. The Successor Agency is authorized to continue to pay and meet the enforceable obligations of the former redevelopment agency, utilizing the tax increment the agency would have received.

The Agency adopted the original Schedule on August 23, 2011 which outlined contractual obligations of the Agency from August 2011 to December 2011. The amended Schedule outlines contractual obligations of the Agency from January 2012 to June 30, 2012. In accordance with the Dissolution Act, the Successor Agency must approve on a semi-annual basis all enforceable obligations. The Successor Agency's Schedule, budget, and asset disposition plan must be reviewed by the Auditor-Controller and approved by a separate seven member Oversight Board. Ultimately, the Schedule, budget, and asset disposition plan may be reviewed by the State Controller's Office or State Department of Finance.

Exhibit "A" delineates the Agency's amended Schedule. It is recommended that the Board of Directors adopt the amended Schedule and authorize staff to transmit it to the County Auditor, State Controller, and the State Department of Finance in accordance with the Dissolution Act. Upon acceptance of the Schedule, it will be posted to the County's website.
