On January 31, 2012 the Victor Valley Economic Development Authority (VVEDA) adopted Resolution 12-004 approving the 2nd Amended Enforceable Obligations Payment Schedule (EOPS) as required pursuant to ABx1 26. VVEDA is transmitting this information under protest since VVEDA is a Joint Powers Authority formed pursuant to Government Code comprising cities as its member entities not redevelopment agencies. The obligations identified herein largely represent the obligations of VVEDA's member jurisdictions since VVEDA's operating authority is limited in capacity and contractually obligated to be carried out by its member jurisdictions. Notwithstanding this protest, we are transmitting this solely for the purpose of procedurally adhering to the provision of ABx1 26.

RESOLUTION NO. 12-004

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSION OF THE VICTOR VALLEY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY APPROVING AND ADOPTING A SECOND AMENDED ENFORCEABLE OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 34169

WHEREAS, the Victor Valley Economic Development Authority ("VVEDA") is a joint powers authority which was formed to cause the reuse of former George Air Force Base (the "Air Base") (now known as Southern California Logistics Airport); and

WHEREAS, VVEDA was formed and presently exists pursuant to a certain Fourth Amended Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (the "Joint Powers Agreement") by and among the City of Victorville, City of Adelanto, City of Hesperia, Town of Apple Valley and County of San Bernardino (individually, a "Member", and collectively, the "Members"); and

WHEREAS, under Section 33492.40 of Health and Safety Code, VVEDA, although not organized as a redevelopment agency, has the legal authority to exercise redevelopment powers in furtherance of the redevelopment of a project area approved by VVEDA and, in addition to exercising the powers of a redevelopment agency, has the authority to act as the legislative body and planning commission for all approvals and actions of the legislative bodies and planning commissions for the adoption and implementation of a redevelopment plan; and

WHEREAS, in order to promote the civilian reuse of the Air Base, VVEDA has undertaken many actions, including, but not limited to, pursuing the adoption of the 1993 Victor Valley Redevelopment Plan, as amended (the "Redevelopment Plan") and establishing the project area subject to the Redevelopment Plan (the "Project Area"); and

WHEREAS, on or about June 28, 2011, as part of the 2011-12 State budget bill, the California Legislature has recently enacted and the Governor has signed companion bills, ABx1 26 and ABx1 27, requiring that each redevelopment agency be dissolved unless the community that created it enacts an ordinance committing it to making certain payments (collectively, the "Redevelopment Restructuring Bills"); and

WHEREAS, specifically, ABx1 26 prohibits agencies from taking numerous actions, effective immediately and purportedly retroactively, and additionally provides that agencies are deemed to be dissolved as of October 1, 2011 (the "Dissolution Bill"); and

WHEREAS, the validity of Redevelopment Restructuring Bills was challenged by petitioners in California Redevelopment Association v. Matosantos, Case No. S194861, as violating the State Constitution and other laws (the "CRA Action"); and

WHEREAS, on or about August 25, 2011, in accordance with the terms of the Dissolution Bill, upon contingencies and reservations set forth in the resolution approving the same, VVEDA adopted an Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule which represented payments to be made by the VVEDA through December 31, 2011 (the "Original Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule"); and

WHEREAS, on or about December 29, 2011, the California Supreme Court issued an opinion in the CRA Action which effectively upheld the Dissolution Bill; and

WHEREAS, in its decision, the California Supreme Court extended certain deadlines set forth in the Dissolution Bill in light of delays resulting from the CRA Action; in particular, any deadline which occurs prior to May 1, 2012 was extended by four months; and

WHEREAS, on or about January 12, 2012, and as a result of such extension, VVEDA adopted an amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule in order to extend the expiration of the time period covered by the Original Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule from December 31, 2011 to April 30, 2012 (the "Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule"); and

WHEREAS, VVEDA deems it desirable to further amend the Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule by adopting the Second Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference, setting forth all the obligations which VVEDA has determined are enforceable obligations within the meaning of Section 34167(d) and which represent payments to be made through April 2012; and

WHEREAS, VVEDA does not nor does it intend through the adoption of this Resolution or otherwise, to waive any constitutional and/or legal rights to challenge the constitutionality and/or lawfulness of the Dissolution Bill or its applicability to VVEDA.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE VICTOR VALLEY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals.

The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Adoption of the Second Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule.

In accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 34169, and based on the Recitals set forth above, the VVEDA Commission hereby adopts the Second Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Under Protest.

While VVEDA currently intends to comply with the provisions of the Dissolution Bill in accordance with the terms of the Supreme Court's decision with respect to the CRA Action, VVEDA still contends that the Dissolution Bill does not apply to VVEDA for several reasons, including, but not limited to, VVEDA's formation as a joint powers authority prior to being granted redevelopment powers, VVEDA's composition of legislative bodies and not redevelopment agencies, and VVEDA's ongoing obligations to redevelop the Air Base. Accordingly, the State has no authority to require VVEDA to comply with any provisions of the Dissolution Bill, including, but not limited to, dissolution, prohibition against receipt of tax proceeds and/or liquidation of assets. As such, any compliance with the Dissolution Bill undertaken by VVEDA pursuant to the terms of the Supreme Court's decision with respect to the CRA Action is under protest and without prejudice to the VVEDA's right to challenge the applicability of the Dissolution Bill to VVEDA

Section 4. Implementation.

The VVEDA Commission hereby authorizes and directs VVEDA's Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, to: (1) post the Second Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule on VVEDA's website; (2) designate a VVEDA representative to whom all questions related to the Second Amended Enforceable Obligations Payment Schedule may be directed; (3) notify, by mail or electronic means, the County Auditor-Controller, the Department of Finance, and the Controller of VVEDA's action to adopt the Second Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule and to provide those persons with the internet website location of the posted schedule and the contact information for VVEDA's designated contact; and (4) to execute and deliver such documents and instruments, and to do such things which may be necessary or proper to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution and to implement the Second Amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule on behalf of VVEDA.

Section 5. CEQA.

The VVEDA Commission finds, under Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 15378(b)(4), that this Ordinance is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") in that it is not a "project," but instead consists of the continuation of a governmental funding mechanism for potential future projects and programs, and does not commit funds to any specific project or program.

Section 6. Effective Date

This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.

Section 7. Certification

The Authority Secretary shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; shall enter the same in the book of original Resolutions of the Victor Valley Economic Development Authority; and shall make a minute of passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the Authority, in the minutes of the meeting at which this Resolution is passed and adopted.
